Around the Cleat...Secure at the Dock!

Increasing winds will be arriving with winter, and a reminder seems appropriate concerning the importance of boaters exercising proper precautions when tying up a boat to a floating dock. Because of less visits to the boat, boaters need to ensure that they use adequate mooring lines and fenders to secure their vessels safely. The investment in time and materials is modest compared to the damage that occurs when a boat comes free of its mooring (which seems to only happen at 2 am with no one around!).

A properly secured vessel will be held by a minimum of four lines: a bow line, two spring lines fore and aft, and a stern line. Use a quality mooring line. I have seen too many boats secured with just a thin piece of polyethylene line. Many boaters favor using double braided nylon line or three strand. Nylon has some stretch to it and absorbs shocks to the boat. Recommended line size:.Under 20 feet 3/8" line, 20 to 30 feet 1/2" line, 30 to 40 feet 5/8" line, 40 to 70 feet 3/4" line. And fenders are like anchors, they can seldom be too big or have too many!
